### EXCEPTIONS & EXEMPTIONS

Students who are not classified as California residents for tuition purposes may qualify for an exception or exemption.

### FILING A RESIDENCY APPEAL

Students may submit an online appeal of their residence classification within 30 days, ONLY if certain criteria are met.

### FORMS

These documents enable you to share information about your residency status, file an appeal and more.

# STUDENTS CLASSIFIED AS NONRESIDENTS. WHAT STEPS TO FOLLOW?



## STEP 1

The campus has notified you that you are classified as a California nonresident. If you feel that you are a resident of California, check with the campus Enrollment/Admissions Office to see if they require additional information from you.

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## STEP 2

Complete and submit any required documents requested by the campus, which may include the CSU Residence Questionnaire (form). It is important that you meet all required deadlines!

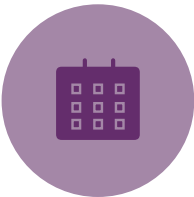
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## STEP 3

The campus will approve or deny you residency classification. Campus will notify you via email or letter. Make sure to look for it.

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## STEP 4

If denied, you may submit an appeal to the California State University Office of the Chancellor within 30 calendar days of the denial of residency. Your appeal must meet certain criteria. For more information regarding appeals refer to the website.
